(Word Style “Calibri”, size 10.5).

KEY WORDS: List 3-5 key words (Word Style “Calibri”, size 10.5).

Instructions for the Preparation of Abstracts

1. Abstracts should be written in English. The fonts and size of abstracts should be as shown in the template above. Abstract font style should be chosen as “Calibri”. Title font should be size 14 (boldface). Authors’ names and corresponding addresses (including work unit and postal code number) should be size 10.5. ‘*’ should be marked on the corresponding author name, and speaker names (usually the first author) should be underlined. The text of abstracts should be size 10.5, each letter of the title and subtitles should be in capitals.
2. Scientific units should be in SI, with capital letters used correctly.
3. The number of references should not exceed 5.
